## ► WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Cycling through each class period

Used to teach SKILLS to an entire class or break up into smaller groups;  
address specific EOC, ACT and AP testing strategies

Provide additional educational enrichment like PBL, presentations, etc. that  
do not fit into regular class time

## ► WHY?

Clears up confusion among students about where they should be and what  
they should be doing

Allows accountability for creating a safer school environment during HIVE.

Solves the issue of students being requested by multiple teachers as well  
as students who need extra assistance and help but are not  
requested

Results in every student being involved in an educational activity during  
HIVE

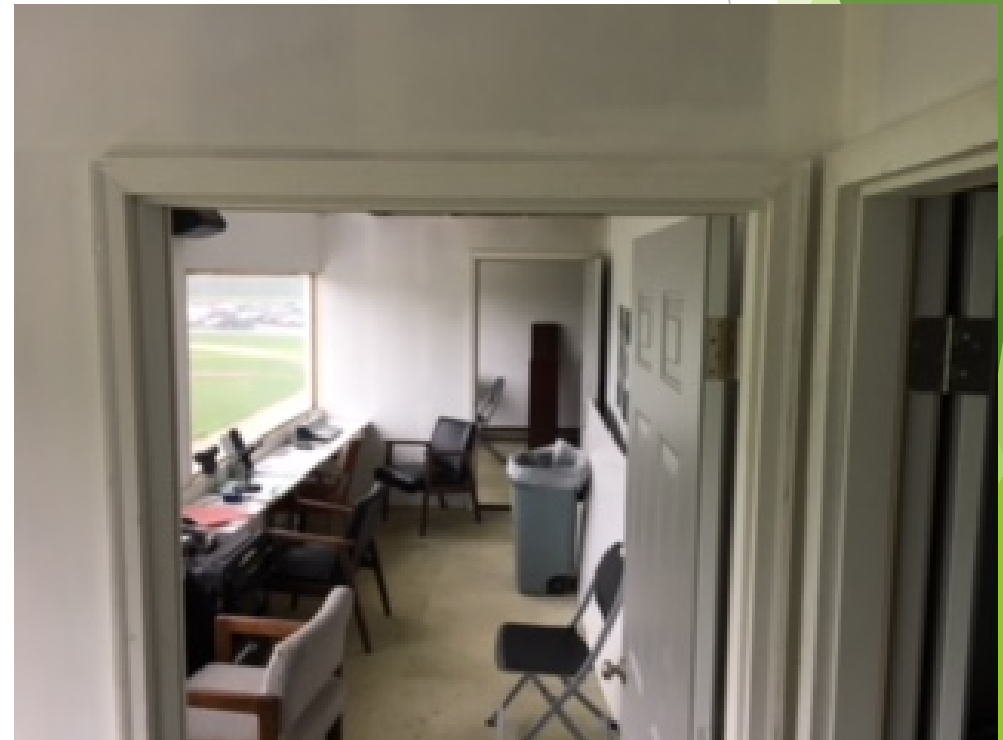

# Superintendent's Report - FACILITIES

- ▶ BEGINNING the Renovations of Multi-purpose Room and Elementary Classroom the week of September 17
- ▶ Transportation - ONE STOP is working! Forms need to be in for students' pick-up and drop-off
- ▶ LUNCH ROOM - WORKING SMOOTHLY with FOUR LUNCHES; most classes are through in ten-twelve minutes
- ▶ Replaced 4 Elementary Classroom Air Conditioners; will continue further replacement next summer

# Superintendent's Report - FACILITIES

- ▶ **SOME MINOR WATER ISSUES in the BUILDING on Sunday Evening**
  - related to condensation issues in new building;
  - one leak in Middle School Gym; water came in through heating unit
  - in Kindergarten rooms - fixed last year and still under warranty
- ▶ **Football Stadium Lights** are getting new switches so they can be shut off with a switch and not in the box location

# Superintendent's Report - TECHNOLOGY

- ▶ *Introducing* NINTH grade students to One-on-One Initiative; insurance available to ninth/tenth grade students with Chrome-books
- ▶ Continue to train teachers in learning management system SCHOOLOGY, PLANBOOK and APP's for learning;
- ▶ Great addition having a TECH ASSISTANT!
- ▶ *Working out the glitches with ON-LINE FORMS*  
*Letters sent home to parents about the new process*

- ▶ **SAFETY COMMITTEE** has established monthly meetings

  - Intruder and Fire Drills are scheduled for September

  - Planning an EMA INSERVICE with Administrators - review SAFETY and Reunification PLANS
