- **Q:** Will my Accuplacer results from Urbana/Franklin University last year be considered for Edison State Community College?
A: Edison State will accept ACCUPLACER scores from other institutions as long as the test was completed within the last two years. The student should submit their official ACCUPLACER score report, along with their HS transcript to CCP@edisonohio.edu OR ESCC – CCP, 1973 Edison Drive, Piqua, OH 45356.

Students who attended a CCP Informational meeting and wish to take Dual Enrollment coursework via Edison State Community College should now prepare for the 19-20 Edison CCP admission cycle. If you have not attended an informational meeting, look to area schools or colleges for potential meeting offerings...you must attend a meeting with your parent to participate.
