Important Information:

- Any student who has a Study Hall during an exam period *MAY* be excused *IF* a permission slip is turned into Mrs. Montgomery in the High School Office *NO LATER THAN Friday Dec. 15th*.
 - If a permission slip is not turned in by the end of the day on the 15th, the student **MUST** be in study hall during the exam period. This includes all student aides.
 - Students are not permitted to leave and come back to school.
- There will be NO open lunch
- If you do not have a 3rd or 6th period exam and you have permission to leave you may stay for lunch; however you must stay the whole lunch period. Students are still not permitted to be in the hallways. Lunch will operate like any other lunch day.
 - If you do not plan to eat lunch you must leave the school grounds promptly after the second exam of the day.

Exam exemptions from the Student Handbook: All students enrolled in a CCP dual enrollment course must take semester exams. Exam exemptions do not apply for classes awarding college credit.

Exam exemptions:

- Teachers may excuse students from taking the exam for their class if the student has an A+ average (97-100). The decision to exempt for A+ average is at the discretion of each individual teacher.
 - Students who have 0 absences (excused and unexcused) AND 2 tardies or less provided that they have a C (76-73) average or better in that class. Students must be enrolled full-time (6 classes per semester) on the Bethel campus (5 for off-campus CCP students).
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PERMISSION TO LEAVE SCHOOL (HS Exams)

High School students are not required to attend classes when they are exempt from exams or have an assigned study hall.

- Students who arrive after school begins but before the next exam period will have to report to study hall in the cafeteria and will not be allowed in the halls or at their lockers.
- Students who arrive after the exam period has begun will not be allowed in the classroom but will report to study hall in the cafeteria and will have to make arrangements after school to complete the exam.
- There will be NO open lunch.

If you are exempt from the 7:30 exam you may arrive on-time for the 9:05 exam. However, students are not permitted to leave school and then come back later in the day. Once a student arrives at school they must stay until their exams are complete.

This form is required. No verbal permissions will be accepted. Forgery of parent signature will result in discipline. Notes will not be accepted after the deadline of Friday, December 15th at 3:15.

PARENTS' QUICK GUIDE to SCHOOL SAFETY COMMUNICATION PROTOCOLS

Bethel Local School District has specific safety procedures and protocols coordinated with town personnel and local safety officials to cover a host of local emergencies. The District's Safety Team meets several times a year with local officials to review and update procedures. These plans are not posted publicly as much of the information is pertinent only to school personnel and local safety officials. In addition, we believe that certain security measures must remain confidential to only these people.

In an effort to strengthen school safety information while not divulging specific security information, we are listing for you the specific safety protocols with the methods of communication that parents would receive in the event of implementing a specific plan. Please see your child's building principal if you have specific questions regarding these procedures.

<p><u>INTRUDER or LOCKDOWN DRILL</u> This refers to a complete LOCKDOWN PROCEDURE or actual danger threatens the safety of the school population; students could be dispersed to different locations per procedures. <i>(An example would be a threatening intruder in the building)</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The building safety designee would announce a total security situation via the school intercom. Superintendent or building safety designee would be responsible for media releases. 	<p>Parents would be notified via ONE CALL if a TOTAL SECURITY SITUATION occurred. Specific instructions would be provided for student pick-up and location.</p>
<p><u>BUILDING EVACUATION</u> The building evacuation protocol is to be followed in the event that the school must be immediately evacuated and children sent to a different location.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The building safety designee would announce a building evacuation via the school intercom. Superintendent or building safety designee would be responsible for media releases. 	<p>Parents would be notified via ONE CALL if a building evacuation occurs with specific instructions for student pick-up and location.</p>
<p><u>BOMB THREAT</u> Building evacuation procedures would be followed as directed by the police department.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The building safety designee would announce a building evacuation via the intercom.
